Our first year as the Tiger Legacy Foundation came with its share of learning moments - and a lot to celebrate. As we head into 2026, we're excited to see our mission of expanding educational opportunities for Lewis & Clark High School students really taking shape.

Thanks to countless volunteer hours and a successful fall golf tournament and auction, we are on track to begin funding grant requests in the early months of 2026. We also hit several important milestones this year, including earning our 501(c)(3) nonprofit status, launching our website, setting up our accounting and donor management systems, and building a strong, collaborative relationship with LCHS administration and faculty.

Like many new organizations, we faced a few growing pains along the way - especially around clarifying roles and improving communication. Those experiences have helped us learn, adjust, and move forward with greater focus.

Looking ahead, we're eager to build on this momentum. In the coming year, we'll continue refining our processes, working more closely with the school on creative and impactful projects, supporting scholarships for deserving students, and strengthening our connections with alumni and the broader community.

We're deeply grateful to the Lewis & Clark High School alumni, administrators, teachers, students, business sponsors, and volunteers who helped make this first year such a strong start.

2025 Overview

The Tiger Legacy Foundation had a very productive first year. It was established as a non-profit corporation in the State of Washington and 501(c)(3) public charity with the Internal Revenue Service. Its board adopted a significant number of important policies and procedures, as well as developing the Tiger Legacy Foundation website, accounting system and donor management systems.

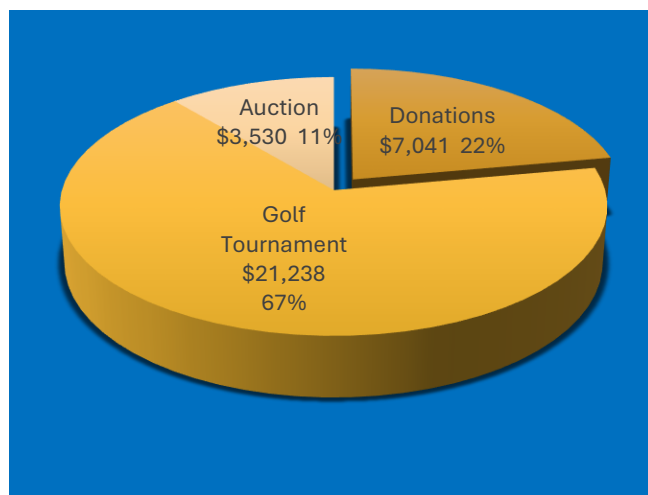
The Foundation's initial fundraising events, a golf tournament and auction in September, raised over \$24,000.

Finally, the Foundation took significant steps towards establishing a strong, collaborative working relationship with the Lewis & Clark High School Administration and Multi-Tier Support Services team.

Financial Performance

Overall, the Foundation did quite well financially during its first year of operation. Its major sources of revenue for the year were its two fundraising events, the golf tournament and auction, and donations from individuals.

In terms of expenses, administrative expenditures included start-up costs for our accounting system, website development, taxes and licenses, and office supplies.

In the general fundraising expenses category, our expenses included costs for various printed materials, brochures, donor appreciation/thank you cards and credit card processing fees.

Because much of our revenue came in the last several months of the year, and because the board and school administration were still working out the procedural details of distributing funds to programs, there were no distributions to programs in 2025. However, there are plans to distribute funds to programs in early 2026.

Governance

Much of 2025 was focused on establishing the Tiger Legacy Foundation as a non-profit corporation committed to accountable governance and organizational effectiveness.

Incorporation and 501(c)(3) Status

In February of 2025, the Tiger Legacy Foundation interim board developed initial Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws for the organization. On February 28, 2025, the Foundation was officially incorporated as a non-profit entity in the State of Washington. On April 17, 2025, the Foundation was granted 501(c)(3) public charity status by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service.
